**Student Success**

Kristen Roulston, our student success teacher works closely with students who are in grade 9 and 10. She monitors student success by working with students and teachers to identify opportunities for students to recover credits and to help teachers in support of credit rescue for struggling students. We will continue to track student success in grades 11, 12 and 12+ through the guidance office. Kristen will continue to work closely with the guidance department and we hold student success round table discussions every three weeks. Our guidance office is already at work tracking our potential graduates to ensure completion of graduation requirements. DHS aims to reach a graduation rate of 85% by 2011.

Anecdotal reports for semester 1 went home with students on Monday, October 4<sup>th</sup> and Parent/teacher interviews took place on Wednesday, October 6<sup>th</sup> from 3:45-6:45 pm in the Gordon Wood Auditorium. **Professional Development for Staff**

We continue to provide opportunities for staff at Dryden High School to attend and participate in professional development to further improve practice.

- Teaching staff at DHS will be involved in job embedded learning opportunities. This is a self-directed opportunity for teachers to collaboratively meet with colleagues to discuss student work and apply effective teaching strategies to moving student achievement forward
- On October 7<sup>th</sup> a team of teachers met and gave their input into the School Improvement Plan. The four areas of focus for the plan will be literacy, numeracy, pathways and community/culture/caring.
