

PROTECTING YOUR IDEA ASSIGNMENT

Canadian Patents Database

1. Go to the Canadian Intellectual Property Office website at: <http://cipo.gc.ca/>
2. Have a look around... see what the site offers...
3. Make your way to the main page for patents. It should look something like:

Part A:

1. Select one of their search options (figure out a way to search patents).
2. You will select **two** products, names, etc that you are interested in (ie: hockey skates and sewing machines)
3. Conduct a patent search on the database for these two items. You will likely find hundreds of patents for each item... pick ONE patent per item. Find one that seems interesting and has lots of information.
4. Write a short report – half a page for each product on your findings. Click on all the tabs from **BIBLIOGRAPHICAL DATA** all the way to **DOCUMENTS**, provide a summary/be sure to answer:
 - a. What kind of/how many results were there?
 - b. When was the patent filed?
 - c. When was the patent issued?
 - d. Who was the patent issued to?
 - e. What exactly is being patented? Describe in detail.
 - f. Summarize any other information that you can.
 - g. Include any pertinent pictures or diagrams (representative drawing tab).



Part B:

1. Research the website to find the steps that one would take to protect the rights to a product/idea/etc. Write a short report on this process. Do your best to **PUT THINGS IN YOUR OWN WORDS**.
